# The United Way of Southington

## **American Red Cross, Charter Oak Chapter**

Provides disaster relief/preparedness; training in first aid, water safety, CPR, HIV/AIDS; serves military personnel and families; supports blood collections when Help Can't Wait.

## **The Arc of Southington, Inc.**

Provides services and support for people with mental retardation and other developmental disabilities. Services and supports including advocacy, family support, education, planning, recreation, residential services, and day/work supports. Member of Arc/CT and The Arc of the United States.

## **CT Yankee Council, Boy Scouts of America**

Including Boy Scout, Cub Scout, and Venture programs for boys ages 7-20 and girls from 14-20. Working through volunteer leadership to develop a value system of character building, citizenship, training and physical, emotional fitness through weekly meetings and outdoor experiences.

## **Bread for Life**

Established for our neighbors in need of food and fellowship. A place for sharing a balanced nutritious meal, no questions asked.

## **Catholic Charities**

Responds to the social service needs of the Southington community through behavioral health counseling, child day care for infants, preschool & school aged children, parent education, family life education,

case management, adoption services, transitional housing for homeless pregnant women and young mothers, life skills training, job development, job training, job placement, job retention services, and community outreach.

## **Child Guidance Clinic for Central CT, Inc.**

Comprehensive mental health services to children, youth and families, including therapy, testing & psychiatric intervention. Home based services to families in crisis or for children at risk of abuse and neglect. Comprehensive sexual abuse treatment program. Consultation and education to groups.

## **Community Mental Health Affiliates, Inc.**

Provides an array of clinical programs for high-risk children, youth and families. Full range of services from psychiatric/psychological assessments and psychotherapy to case management, outreach, advocacy, family empowerment, vocational rehabilitation, case coordination and community education. Twenty-four hour mobile emergency and crisis intervention service available.

## **Connecticut Legal Services, Inc.**

Provides free civil legal services to the poor. Areas of specialty include domestic violence/family, homelessness/housing, public benefits, special education, elder and disability law.

## **Employment Development Center**

Private, non-profit organization providing community opportunities, skill training, job placement, and counseling to persons with disabilities in Central Connecticut.

## **Family Services of Central Connecticut, Inc.**

Provides individual, couple, and family counseling, adoption services, parent training, family life education, support for families transitioning from welfare to work, life skills training, low-interest loans to working poor families.

## **Girl Scouts, Connecticut Trails Council, Inc.**

Provides comprehensive informal educational programs for girls ages 5-17, stressing development of a positive self-image, leadership skills, and service to the community.

## **2-1-1 Infoline A Program of United Ways of CT**

A free, confidential 24-hour telephone service offering help, information and referral for human services, crisis intervention, suicide prevention, and child care resources; Spanish speaking staff and TDD available.

## **Literacy Volunteers of America-New Britain/Bristol, Inc.**

Recruits and trains volunteers to effectively tutor adults who wish to improve their ability to read, write or speak English. We match tutors/students and provide quality follow-up support.

## **Margaret C. Griffin Child Development Center of Southington, Inc.**

Offers all day care in a warm, nurturing environment for fifty preschool children ages 3-6 years. Intended to serve families who need child care to work or attend school. Before and/or after school care is available for kindergarten children.

## **Nutmeg Big Brothers/Big Sisters-Foster Grandparents**

Addressing the needs of at-risk youth in Southington by carefully screened, professionally supervised adult volunteers who spend at least 6 hours each month for at least 6 months to one year in a one-to-one mentoring relationship with an assigned child.

## **Prudence Crandall Center for Women, Inc.**

Comprehensive services to victims of domestic violence include: 24-hour-hot lines, emergency shelter for women and children, counseling, support groups, child advocacy, court advocacy, information and referrals and community education.

## **Retired and Senior Volunteer Program of Central Connecticut, Inc. (R.S.V.P.)**

Provides volunteer opportunities for persons 55 years and older to enrich their lives and to provide service for their communities of Berlin, Meriden, New Britain, Southington and Wallingford.

## **Salvation Army**

Wide range of social services including emergency food, fuel,

furniture and clothing; Holiday services, overnight camp for needy children, woodland vacation lodge for senior citizens and scholarships for needy high school students.

## **Sexual Assault Crisis Services, YWCA of New Britain**

Provides free, confidential services to victims of sexual assault and their significant others including: crisis intervention, short term counseling, support groups, ER/police and court advocacy and community education on topics such as 'Good Touch', 'Bully Proofing', 'Date Rape', 'Self Defense', and 'Sexual Harassment'.

## **Southington Community YMCA**

Provides an oasis for all people in the community to nurture the healthy development of children, encourage positive behavior in teens & strengthen families.

## **United Way of Southington Emergency Fuel Bank**

Assists Southington residents in danger of having no heat or electricity through uncontrollable circumstances.

## **Visiting Nurse Association of Central CT, Inc.**

Home health care services including nursing, aides, homemakers, companions, therapies, social services, Hospice of Central CT, support groups, senior and child health clinics and public health services.
